Volume

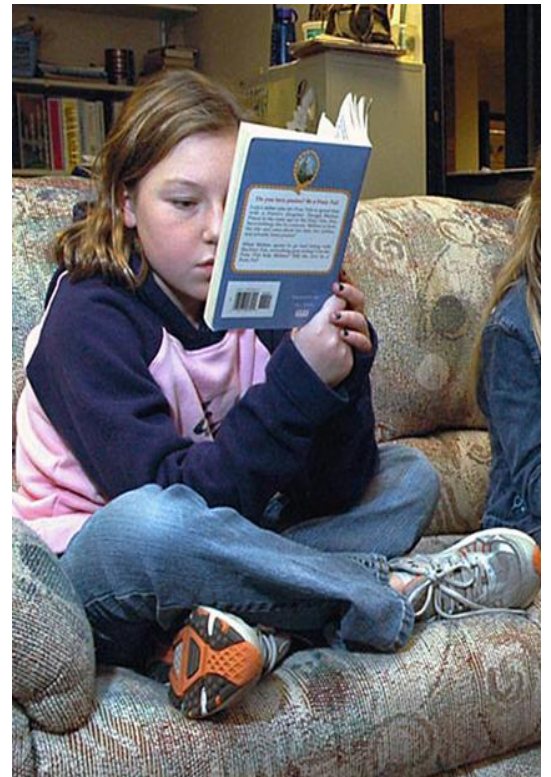
The more kids read the better they read.

Access

Books! Books! Books!

Response

The more kids interact the more they learn and understand.



Explicit Instruction

Kids need both teacher modeling and time to practice.

Purpose

Readers must see reading as a meaningful experience.

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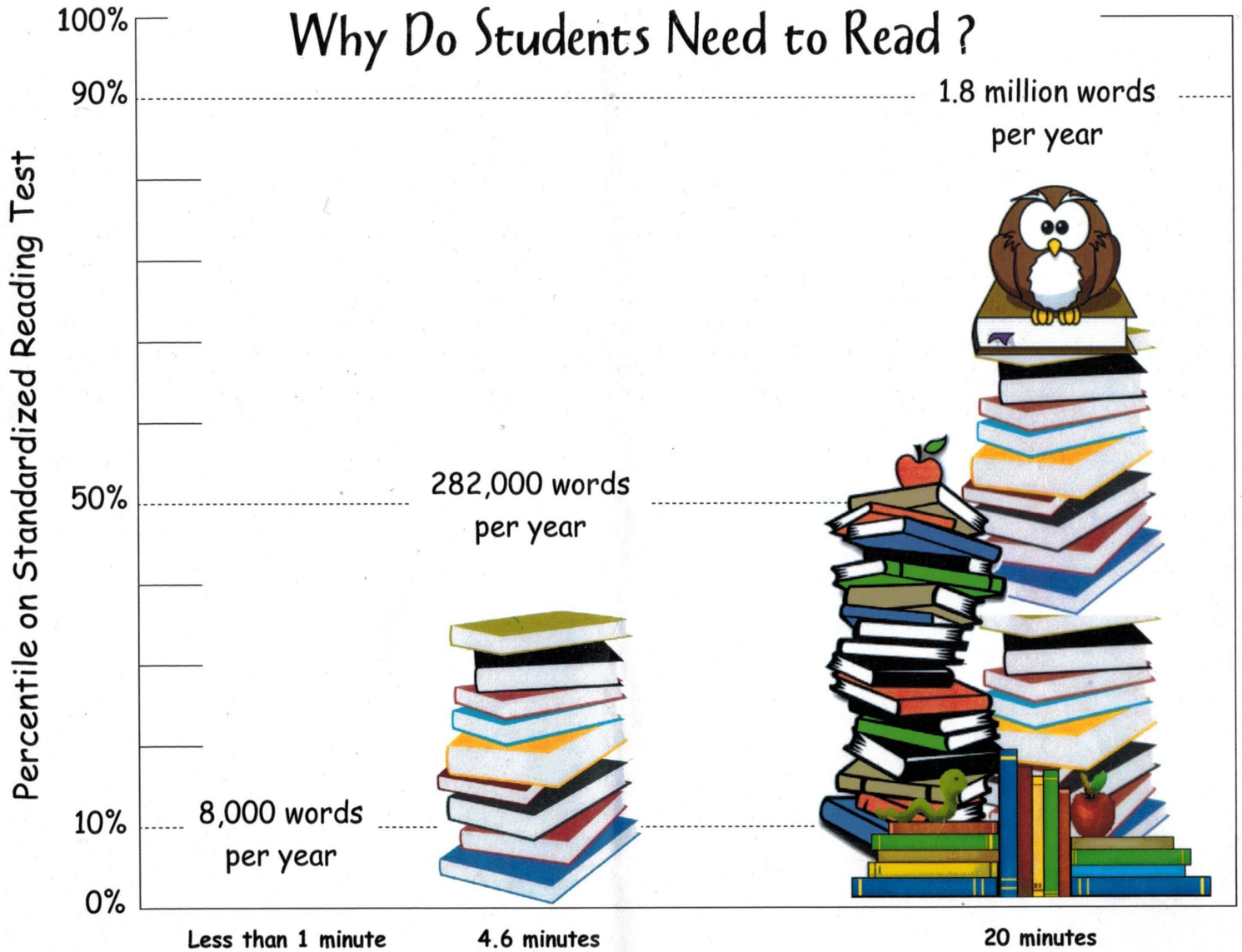
