- Write a "Connections" paper in which you explain the connections between 3-5 ideas you learned about at the convention and how or what you teach. In other words, how do you "practice" (already) or "plan to practice" the concepts and/or theories you have heard about at the convention?
- Identify 2-3 professional development goals you have as a result of your attendance and participation at this WSRA Convention.
