Amina's Voice by Hena Khan

(Middle Grade) The story centers around Amina dealing with the start of middle school, friendship drama, family conflict—familiar challenges for any kid. But Amina is also a Pakistani American Muslim, and the book is a window into her faith, culture, and community.

(Picture Book) This book is about the coolest low-riding cat, Chato, whose new neighbors are the tastiest-looking family of mice. Chato and his best friend prepare for a welcoming feast, except for the main dish (who are also the guests of honor). The surprise happens when mice bring a special guest of their own.
