Half Spoon of Rice: A Survival Story of Cambodian Genocide by Icy Smith [Cambodia]

The harrowing story of a young boy's survival under the Khmer Rouge regime and his journey toward hope and resilience.

A Song for Cambodia by Michelle Lord [Cambodia]

The inspiring true story of Arn Chorn-Pond, a boy who survived the Cambodian genocide and used music to heal and advocate for peace.

The Librarian's Stories by Lucy Falcone [Bosnia]

Workers' Rights

Thanks to Frances Perkins: Fighter for Workers' Rights by Deborah Hopkinson

The inspiring story of Frances Perkins, the first female cabinet member, who fought tirelessly for workers' rights and social reforms.

Brave Girl: Clara and the Shirtwaist Makers' Strike of 1909 by Michelle Markel

This true story follows Clara Lemlich, a young immigrant who led one of the largest strikes in U.S. history to demand fair treatment for garment workers.

<u>Dolores Huerta: A Hero to Migrant Workers</u> by Sarah Warren

Written by Supreme Court Justice Sonia Sotomayor, this book encourages children to embrace differences by learning about disabilities and unique abilities.
