Guidelines for: Outstanding Administrator Award

Purpose of the award:

The purpose of the Outstanding Administrator Award is to honor Wisconsin administrators who demonstrate outstanding leadership in the field of literacy.

Nomination Procedure:

- Select one (1) administrator in your local council's area to nominate for this award.
- Gather three letters of support representing the following sources:
 - teachers
 - local council president
 - immediate supervisor
 - board member
 - parent, etc.
- Letters of support should include the following information:
 - Evidence that the administrator is an advocate for reading
 - Statements delineating the administrator's knowledge about the field of reading and that his/her leadership reflects current research and practice
 - Evidence of being an outstanding role model for administrators, parents, students and teachers
 - Evidence that the administrator has encouraged and supported literacy in the home, school, and community
- If available, include a copy of the administrator's resume (not required).
- Local Councils may submit one entry per year.
- Honored Administrators receive a plaque and a one year membership to WSRA at the WSRA Annual Convention.
- Submit nomination form, supporting letters and resume, if available, to the Awards and Honors Committee on or before the deadline of November 1st.
